Level	Reason	Actions
Green	All children start at this level at the beginning of each new term or upon enrolment.	Whole school reward system
Yellow: Flagging	1 minor incident	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Classroom teacher may contact parents to inform them and further investigate student's behaviour.
Orange Warning Behaviour Causing Concern	2 minor incidences or 1 major incident <i>Special conditions may apply if a 'major behaviour' occurs when a student is representing the school. Loss of privileges may result.</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Executive Teacher to contact parents via phone if possible. Warning of Reflection (Formal Caution) Letter to parents informing them of the warning and future incidences will require the student to attend "Reflection". Parents should be informed that awards won't be given out if student are attending reflection (Positive behaviour is noted however no formal award).
Red Level 1 Warning of suspension	1 more incidence Escalation of behaviours in the playground or the classroom	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Executive Teachers to contact parents via phone and informed of behaviour. Student will be attending "Reflection" during lunch time for one or more consecutive day/s (Kinder -1 day, Stage 1-2 day and Stage 2 & 3-3 days). No PBL awards should be given during this time. Student will be excluded from privileges (E.g. PSSA sport, Party Day, Stage Disco etc.) for the duration of "Reflection" time.
Reflection Room		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Lunch time only (excluding eating time). Reflection worksheets are completed. Principal signs worksheets. Letter to parents sent home stating that reflection was completed with a warning of suspension should the behaviour continue.
Red Level 2 Suspension	Suspension	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Principal will contact parents. Student will be suspended. A resolution meeting will be planned to discuss support for the student's return to school.

*Reflection

During lunch time, after students have eaten their lunch they meet with one of the Executive teachers to discuss what happened during the incident, they discuss and revisit the school values, talk about what they should do next time and may even write a letter of apology. Copies of the worksheets are sent home to parents once completed. Reflection may take place over 1 to 3 days (depending on the grade of the student).
